EXECUTIVE Letter



YEAR-IN Review

Our Courageous Work

This past year the fruits of our consistent, courageous work led to incredible change! As we wove together advocacy, community-driven education, community engagement, and strategic partnerships, we developed holistic, health care solutions centered on those most impacted by pressing injustices. Our efforts have achieved real results that impact the lives of Illinoisans every day. A few highlights from the year include:

Advocacy

After years of advocating for state policies to correct disparities in the health care ecosystem, EverThrive IL celebrated this year's monumental state-wide legislative rulings. **Illinois House Bill 5142** dictates that health insurance companies must cover pregnancy-related and abortion services without extra costs. In addition, it requires private insurance to cover services provided by midwives, doulas, and lactation consultants. **Illinois House Bill 2499** prohibits the sale of junk insurance plans that do not meet the minimum standards under the federal Affordable Care Act. **Illinois Senate Bill 3136** creates the Family Recovery Plans Implementation Task Force which will review and recommend models of family recovery plans for pregnant people and families struggling with substance use disorder.



Education


Now in its second year, **The Gathering** continues to increase its reach, proving to be a valuable resource for Black pregnant people and their communities. This digital resource provides tools for Black pregnant or recently pregnant people and their friends and families to empower them to care for and advocate for themselves and their loved ones.

Community Engagement

For over 25 years, we have helped increase vaccine confidence in Illinois. Our **National Infant Immunization Campaign**, involving digital media and face-to-face outreach, continues to offer individuals living in Black and Brown communities in Chicago accurate education on the importance of vaccines and helpful connections to immunization providers.

Strategic Partnership

After a highly competitive open grant process, **MacKenzie Scott's Yield Giving awarded EverThrive Illinois \$2 million** to support our mission to achieve reproductive justice in the health care ecosystem. This award allows us to move swiftly and boldly to expand our programming, drive policy change, and connect with more community members.





OUTREACH IMPACT SPOTLIGHT

My name is Me'sha Burton, and I am a Community Outreach Worker at EverThrive Illinois. The community outreach worker position is important because many people in the community don't have the information they need. Having an individual disseminate the information is vital so everyone can be knowledgeable about what's going on when it comes to vaccines.

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SHOWERING YOUNG FAMILIES WITH SUPPORT

Coinciding with National Infant Immunization Week, EverThrive Illinois hosted its 2nd Annual Community Baby Shower on April 27, 2024 at the Homan Square Community Center in North Lawndale. The event aimed to educate families on the importance of immunizations and share resources to support the health of children, parents, and parents-to-be.

Talibah Johnson, EverThrive IL's Community Engagement Manager, presented information on local immunization resources, while Chicago U-Medics provided First Responders' call training which educated community members on how to call first responders in an emergency. Local vendors, including the Chicago South Side Birth Center and County Care, were present to connect families with valuable services such as maternal mental health care, insurance coverage information, doula care, and literacy programs.

The baby shower served as both an educational event and a celebration for the community, offering food, games, and a raffle for WNBA Chicago Sky tickets. Attendees received gift bags, which included essential baby items like clothes, diapers, and breastfeeding supplies.



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Many families don't get the opportunity to have their own baby shower due to socioeconomic barriers or other circumstances, so it was amazing to host one for the entire community to celebrate parents and their little ones,



BUILDING HEALTHY COMMUNITIES

My name is Arias Benitez - Perez and I'm the Immunization Equity Manager. I know that EverThrive Illinois is making a difference based on the conversations that I have with community members and stakeholders. Constantly, we're being told that they've never been invited to a table where they could be thought partners with the Chicago Department of Public Health and other health entities. We also have stakeholders saying that they've never been able to hear directly from community members.

The Equitable Vaccine Advisory Council (EVAC) is unique to other approaches to immunization education, mainly because we're bringing different community members and stakeholders together to be thought partners, to discuss barriers, and really talk about their lived experiences with vaccinations and access to care in general. It definitely means the world to me to be able to bring people together that may have never been in the same room, and share those lived experiences and amplify that hyperlocal perspective. The most important thing to remember about EVAC is that we are accountable to community members and the stakeholders who are in the room are accountable to the community. It's something we take very seriously.

FOCUS ON The future

For nearly 40 years, EverThrive Illinois has been advancing the health and safety of Illinoisans by supporting access to quality health care and providing resources to achieve health equity. In FY25, we will focus our efforts on four strategic priorities to foster a healthier, stronger state for all:

Achieve Birth Equity

We will ensure that pregnant and postpartum people in Black and Brown communities receive high-quality care for safe and healthy births by expanding access to culturally sensitive perinatal physical and mental health services and creating resources for navigating these systems. Our initiatives include developing region-specific workshops with social service providers, enhancing universal newborn support systems, and advocating for policies to improve access to pregnancy and postpartum care.

Expand Access to Comprehensive Health Care

We will ensure that everyone has access to high-quality, affordable health insurance and the holistic health care they need to thrive. This includes developing resources to improve health literacy and immunization rates, expanding the community health worker program and certification beyond Chicago, and strengthening consumer protections and benefits for all Illinoisans. Additionally, we aim to enhance access to care for adolescents, empowering them to confidently navigate the health care system.

Unite With Partners to Advance Reproductive Justice

We will expand our network of partners across the state to build momentum and advance reproductive justice. This includes increasing EverThrive IL's presence in central and downstate regions, strengthening collaborations with hospitals and medical schools, and enhancing our infrastructure to support partnership development and structural change.

Create Safe and Sustainable Communities

We will create systems that address the economic, social, and structural needs of families to enhance their health and well being. This includes improving access to housing, transportation, paid family leave, and reducing food insecurity for new families through WIC advocacy and promotion.

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
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
