

## Recommended Immunizations for Children Aged

# 6 Months

Write the Date received in the box next to the vaccine once your child has received it.

<b>HepB</b>	<b>Hepatitis B</b> (this dose may be administered anywhere from 6-18 months. Talk to your provider for more information.)	(Dose 3 of 3)	Date received
<b>RV*</b>	<b>Rotavirus</b>	(Dose 3 of 3)	Date received
<b>DTaP</b>	<b>Diphtheria, Pertussis, &amp; Tetanus</b>	(Dose 3 of 5)	Date received
<b>Hib*</b>	<b>Haemophilus influenzae type b</b>	(Dose 3 of 4)	Date received
<b>PCV15, PCV20</b>	<b>Pneumococcal disease</b>	(Dose 3 of 4)	Date received
<b>IPV</b>	<b>Polio</b> (This dose may be administered anywhere from 6-18 months. Talk to your provider for more information.)	(Dose 3 of 4)	Date received
<b>COVID-19**</b>	<b>Coronavirus disease 2019</b> (These vaccinations are given once a year, starting at 6 months. Talk to your provider for more information.)	(Dose 1 of 1)	Date received
<b>Flu†</b>	<b>Influenza</b> (These vaccinations are given once a year, starting at 6 months. Talk to your provider for more information.)	(Dose 1 of 1)	Date received
<b>RSV*</b>	<b>Respiratory Syncytial Virus</b> (This dose can be administered anywhere from birth-19 months. Talk to your doctor or health care provider for more information.)	(Dose 1 of 1)	Date received

### FOOTNOTES

#### RV\* Hib\*

A third dose at age 6 months may be needed depending on the brand of Hib or rotavirus vaccine used for previous doses. Talk to your child's doctor or healthcare provider for more information.

#### COVID-19\*\*

Annual COVID-19 vaccination is recommended for children 6-23 months, and yearly for children 2 years and older in specific groups or if parents choose protection. Number of doses depends on your child's age and vaccine type.

#### Flu†

Two doses given at least 4 weeks apart are recommended for children age 6 months through 8 years of age who are getting an influenza (flu) vaccine for the first time and for some other children in this age group. The flu shot should be received yearly.

#### RSV\*

Your child might need an RSV vaccine. Talk to your doctor or health care provider for more information.
